Description of Committee: The statewide bibliographic standards committee hopes to have representatives from each public library system including catalogers, system staff, and other technical services staff. The committee will participate in monthly meetings for one year. The hope is the group will continue to meet and become a permanent statewide committee after the first year's commitment.

Possible Tasks for Committee:

- Determine grant cycle meeting schedule and topic timeline.
- Determine decision making guidelines
 - One vote/system
- Research and analyze system bibliographic records?
 - Work with Lindsay on this
- Work towards cataloging best practices for general guidelines for minimum standards
- Establish relationship with WISCAT representative
 - Christine Barth's position? Jen will reach out.
- Work with WISCAT partners for guidance in improving accessibility through bibliographic improvement

- Provide recommendations from bibliographic standards group on database maintenance, local and inclusive headings
- Recruitment of new members annually and as needed

Repository for documentation - LEAN WI has set up a GitHub "Cooperative Cataloging" team. Looking for volunteers to take a look...mess around in there, spin up a repository or projects to see if the thing seems intuitive enough to use without having to earn a degree in document management.

OCLC statewide cost structure improvements update from Steve: WiLS staff shared information on a report from a few years ago from the International Coalition of Library Consortia (ICOLC) that had sought a better relationship with OCLC regarding pricing and other concerns. The report was very thorough and had legitimate concerns, but resulted in very little change on the part of OCLC. The recommendation is to continue to work with WiLS on information sharing related to OCLC, but not include this project in our grant.
