Updates:

- 1) **Bib Record Analysis** - Lindsay from La Crosse Public Library
 - a) Large print questions
 - i) 008 r for reprint, instead of 2 dates
 - ii) 020 standardization plan - Qualify (Suggested best practices?)
 - iii) 245 GMDs for large print - Determined by Discovery Layer
 - iv) 250 Large print edition (Suggested best practices?)
 - v) 336 still image : may not align with regular print resource
 - vi) Matching 490, 520, 650, 655 with regular print records
 - vii) 650 or 655 for Large print, often using different thesauri for terms
 - viii) Suggestion made to not worry about exact formatting of period placement, etc. becoming too granular, keep to more general guidelines when creating style guide
 - ix) Suggestion made to keep subject terms the same between formats and looking across record formats for similarities/ discrepancies to keep consistent
 - x) Question of RDA and ADA Accessibility Best Practices in relation to bibliographic records- follow-up research
 - xi) Discussion and consideration of having the created style guide provide suggested practices for more granular data that discovery layers may impact
